

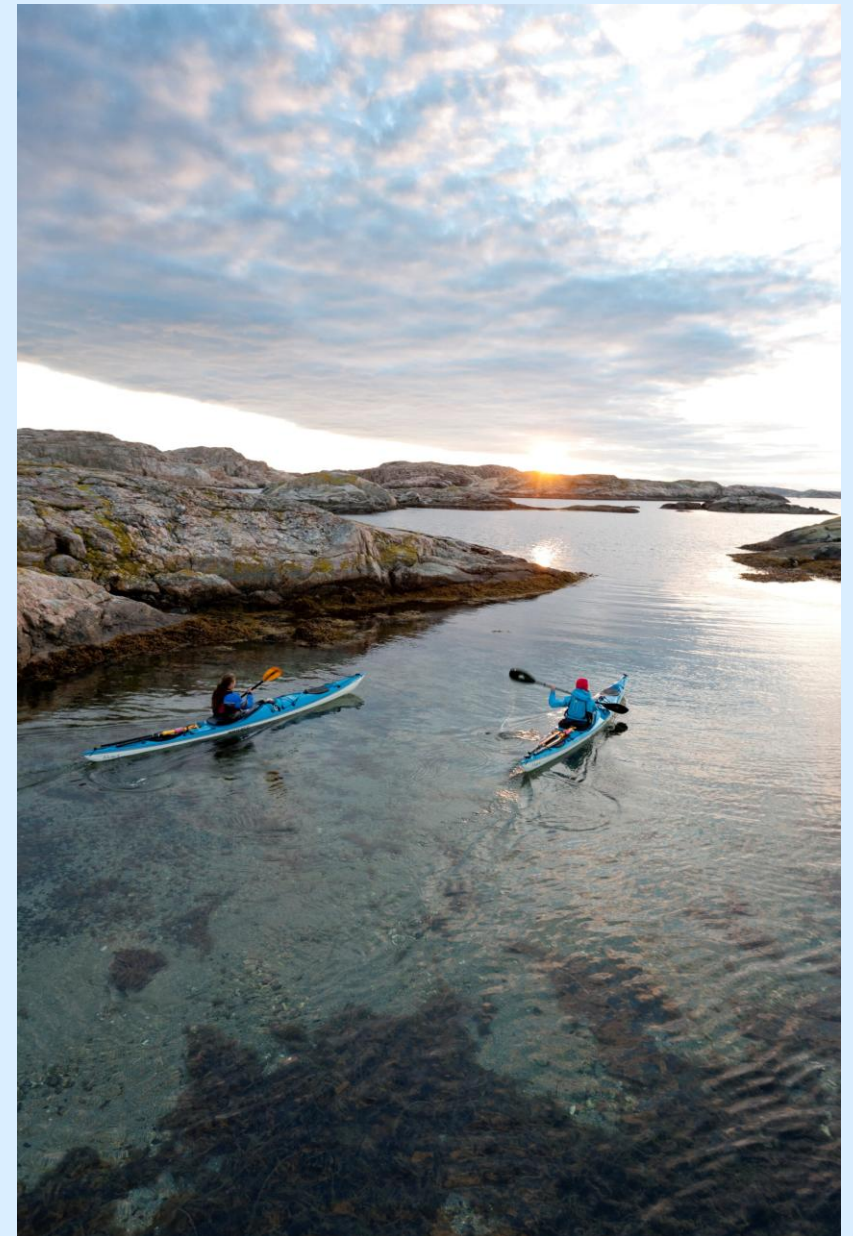


The Swedish Implementation Council



The Implementation Councils mission (Mandate)

- **Monitor** the European Commission's initiatives for new or amended legislation
- **Identify and prioritize EU legal acts** with a high impact on the regulatory burden, costs, competitiveness and growth of businesses
- **Provide early-stage analyses** of upcoming EU legal acts ahead of Government negotiations
- **Provide recommendations** on implementation of EU legal acts



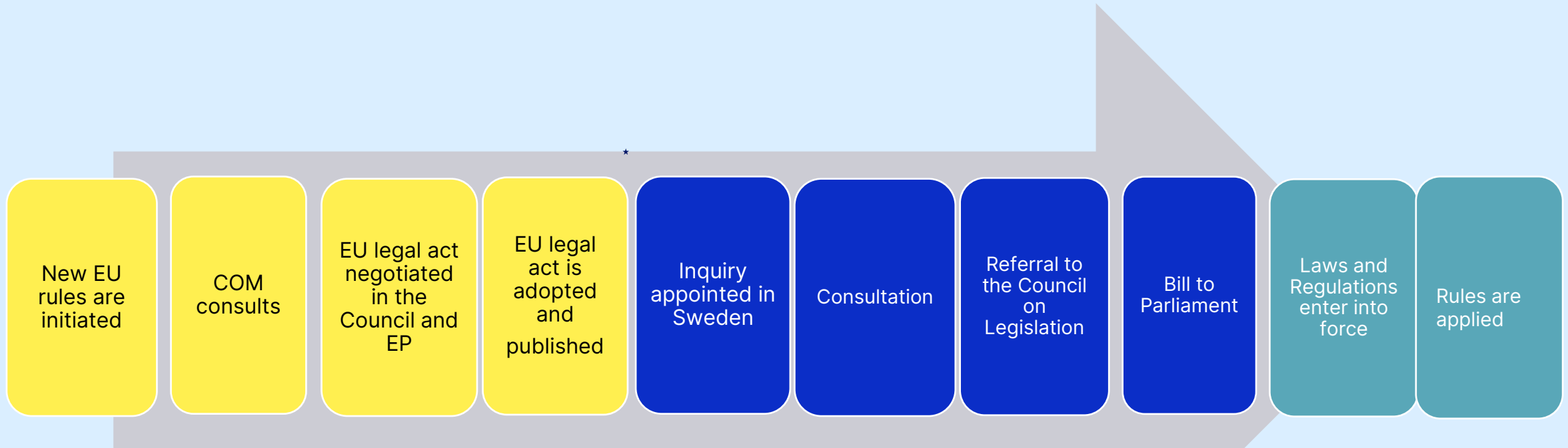

- **Chairman** Anders Johannesson
- **The board:** 8 members nominated by business organisations and academia
- **Secretariat**, Director Lena Hägglöf
- **7** committee **secretaries**
- Appointed until December 31 of 2027



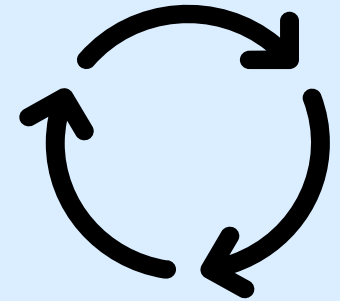
Timeline of the legislative process



The Implementation Council's mission: prioritize, provide documentation with analyses and recommendations during this phase.

Annual cycle for prioritization of EU legal acts

- Commission Work Programme.
- Vote of the members of the Council.
- The priority acts are divided into three groups; A, B and C.
- If necessary, reprioritization takes place.
- Follow-up after about six months.



Priorities for 2026

Group A: Environmental omnibus, 28th Regime for Innovative Companies (EU Inc). European Innovation Act, Omnibus to simplify energy product legislation, Public Procurement Act, European Product Acts, Circular Economy Act.

Group B: Omnibus on taxation, Communication on better regulation, Simplifying defence and sensitive security procurement, Energy Union package, Climate package, Update of rules on unfair trading practices in the food chain, Digital Fairness Act, Quality Jobs Act, Update of the governance of the Energy Union and Climate Action including the phase-out of fossil fuels subsidies

Group C: European integrated framework for climate resilience, Fair labour mobility package

Reprioritisation can take place during the year.

Calculation Model of Regulatory Impact

- Assignment Jönköping University
- We can calculate the impact of regulation on economic growth based on a growth model of Swedish businesses
- Important for the development of impact assessments for businesses arising from EU legal acts
 - By calculate the change in value added we get an approximation of the impact on Sweden's competitiveness for a given industry
 - In the calculative procedure we can also calculate administrative costs

The Council has provided guidance on strengthening the consideration of companies in EU legislation

1. Describe the consequences for Swedish companies early – use input from business organisations
2. Consider the competitiveness of Swedish companies
 - Promote technology-neutral and market-driven solutions and the use of standards
 - Design the rules to suit the smaller companies
3. Reduce administration and regulatory burden
 - Work towards simple, clear and predictable legal acts
 - Promote digital solutions, "one way in" and simplified reporting
4. Reduce implementation costs
 - Promote harmonisation and reduce national special requirements.
 - Ensure clear relationship between regulations and uniform definitions
 - Avoid leaving important elements to delegated/implementing acts
 - Promote proper transition periods and gradual entry into force
 - If possible, use pre-existing reporting structures.
